BLACK-BACKED JACKAL

Purpose

The purpose of this exercise is to give the SAHGCA member an opportunity to use their problem animal control hunting firearms within the rules of this exercise in order to hone this specific hunting capability. The target is a Black-backed Jackal and all shots on the target have a positive count. Five points will be deducted for every shot that miss the Jackal.

Rules:

1. Although this exercise is developed for so-called “varmint” hunting firearms, any centre fire firearm that may be legally utilised for this purpose will be accepted.
2. The use of shooting aids is acceptable and the firearm may be supported in front as well as behind the trigger.
3. The exercise is shot over 300m
4. No limit is set on the telescope enlargement.
5. Maximum number of countable shots are 5
6. After the shooter has completed the exercise he may stand back on condition that his firearm is made safe by insertion of a safety flag or opening of the bolt.
7. The time allowed for the exercise is 120 sec after all shooters have declared themselves ready and the range officer has given the instruction to start firing.
8. Provision will be made to “sight in” the firearms from 100m before the start of the exercise. Participants should however ensure that their rifles are sighted accurately before the competition starts and it is advisable that you have correct observation equipment.
9. The prescribed target is the SAHGCA Black-backed Jackal as shown below.

Exercise:

1. Five (5) shots fired at 300m from any position with the aid of appropriate support., (Max score: 150)
2. Awards may be earned as follows out of a total of 150
 - a. Gold- 120
 - b. Silver- 105
 - c. Bronze - 90



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
